Dear Program Coordinator,

As Chair of the Department of Biomedical and Pharmaceutical Sciences, I would like to provide my enthusiastic support of Dr. Dong Xu, a highly promising early-stage investigator, for his grant proposal to the ITHS Translational Research Scholars Program.

Dr. Xu's proposal describes a translational and interdisciplinary project in which he will use advance computational and experimental methods to screen and identify any FDA-approved drugs for the new indication of inhibiting a key exotoxin in *C. Sordellii*, a lethal bacterium in humans and animals.

While this proposal entails a test-of-concept, one-year pilot project, I believe it has a very strong potential of success, which generate important preliminary data for an NIH R-type grant submission. My assessment is based on:
