Many digital mental health interventions, including apps, are effective in treating common mental health disorders. However, the real world implementation of digital health interventions in healthcare systems has generally not succeeded. This talk will describe the reasons for those failures and research methods that can overcome them. Dr. Mohr's research focusing on the design, evaluation, and adaptation of the IntelliCare platform will be presented to illustrate some of these methods.
