The Institute of Translational Health Sciences (ITHS) is excited to announce a request for applications for our KL2 Multidisciplinary Clinical Research Career Development Program. NIH-funded through the Clinical and Translational Science Awards Program, the ITHS KL2 Program accepts postdoctoral level trainees, fellows, and early-career junior faculty interested in conducting translational research. The KL2 Program is open to applicants from all disciplines and backgrounds who meet the eligibility criteria.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The ITHS KL2 Program is a mentored career development training program that gives early-career researchers time and support to pursue their research. KL2 Scholars commit 75% of their full-time effort towards conducting research and participating in programmatic elements like the KL2 Seminar Series, ITHS events, and cohort building activities.

Through a combination of thoughtful mentorship, interdisciplinary interaction, and focused training, KL2 Scholars receive the career development tools they need to become impactful translational researchers. By the end of their appointments, all ITHS KL2 Scholars will feel confident moving on to individual K or R Awards to further their careers in translational research.

BENEFITS

ITHS KL2 Scholars receive:

- 75% salary support (up to \$85,000 per year) plus benefits for up to 3 years
- \$25,000 per year in research funds
- \$4,000 per year for travel to professional meetings and conferences

ELIGIBILITY

To be considered for the KL2 Program, applicants must:

- Be a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident (with verification documents).
- Be at an early stage of their career. Applicants should not have been in a tenure-track Assistant Professor position for more than two years at the time of application.
- Have a research or health-professional doctoral degree applicable to translational research.
- Be able to commit a minimum of 75% of full-time professional effort for career development and research activities associated with the program. The remaining 25% effort can be divided among other non-federally-funded research, clinical time, and teaching activities.

Applicants must not:

- Be simultaneously submitting or have pending an application for any other PHS mentored career development award (e.g., K07, K08, K22, K23) that duplicates the provisions of the KL2 program.
- Be a former or current principal investigator on:
 - Any NIH research project grant (not including NIH Small Grants (R03) or Exploratory/ Developmental (R21) grants or their equivalents)
 - o Non-PHS peer reviewed research grants with over \$100,000 direct costs per year
 - Sub-projects of program project (P01) or center grants (P50)
- Conduct research outside of the United States.
- Be simultaneously participating in clinical fellowships leading to clinical certification (with some exceptions).
- Accept salary support from other Public Health Service-funded grants.
