- Wise logistics resource
- Point person for Nurses, IRB, CRBB, Sponsor and other Coordinators
- Local protocol expert
- PIs right hand for organization, administration, orchestration and coordination of a complex research plan

RCs are Gatekeepers for the First and Foremost Responsibilities of Enrollment, Consent and Quality Data

- Inclusion/Exclusion criteria
- Quality informed consent process
- Data must be correct, relevant and an accurate evaluation of outcomes


